I, Frank William Edlin, being of the age 48 years, hereby apply for membership in this Society by right of blood descent in the following line from: James Madison Sr. who was born in Montpelier, Va. on the 27th day of March 1722 and died in Montpelier, Va. on the 27th/29th day of February 1801 and who assisted in establishing American Independence. I was born in St. Louis, Mo. County of No County on Birth Record State of Mo. Moberg on the 25th day of October 1916.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

Applicant affirms his adherence to the principles set forth in the Declaration of Independence and his unswerving support of the Constitution of the United States of America, to the end that the inalienable rights of the citizen may be preserved and our ideal representative government perpetuated.

Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in this Society who, being at the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the blood descendant of an ancestor who was at all times unflinching in his loyalty to, and rendered active service in, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, militiaman or minute man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain. - Constitution of National Society, S.A.R., Article III

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one Revolutionary ancestor, and it is desired to file additional claims, separate applications on special forms provided for the purpose, should be made in each case and filed with the original.

State fully such documentary or traditional authority as you found the following record upon, and also the residence of ancestor, with dates of birth and death, if known. By order of the Board of Trustees, May 3, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership dues, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

- Colonel, paid for collection of Arms October 24, 1775. This was James Madison, Sr. who was a member of the Committee of Safety in Orange County, Va. Member of Committee of Safety 1774-1777. * Lieutenant of Orange County, Va., before 1778. Was Colonel for Home Defense, being too old for field duty. * Same document was signed by his son, James Madison, who later became 4th President of the United States.
